

Art: 'Art and Design: Every Picture tells a story' assessment record

Lesson 1, To evaluate and analyse creative work using the language of art, craft and design and To understand that art can have both meaning and message

Key assessment questions:

- Can children evaluate and analyse a work of street art and relate it to the news and current affairs and to British Values?
- Can children suggest how an image could be altered to change its message?

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Lesson 2, To create a symmetrical, abstract art form

Key assessment questions:

- Can children work in the style of Rorschach to create a symmetrical abstract image?
- Can children use my imagination to interpret and add detail to my image?

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Lesson 3, To use visual symbols to create a meaningful message

Key assessment questions:

- Can children create a meaningful message using visual symbols?
- Can children describe how people throughout history have used visual symbols?

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Lesson 4, To evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design and To use drama as a tool to explore the meaning behind a piece of artwork

Key assessment questions:

- Can children express how a piece of artwork makes them feel?
- Can children compare events in a piece of artwork to current news and the 'Fundamental British Values'?
- Can children use drama to demonstrate my understanding of the meaning of a piece of artwork?

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Lesson 5, To develop ideas for 3D work through drawing and visualisation in 2D.

Key assessment questions:

- Can children use their whole arm to draw big shapes?
- Can children use curved lines to suggest three dimensional shapes?
- Can children name key features of Magdalene Odundo's artwork?

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
