## Art: 'Art and Design: Every Picture tells a story' assessment record

<u>Lesson 1.</u> To evaluate and analyse creative work using the language of art, craft and design and To understand that art can have both meaning and message

#### Key assessment questions:

- Can children evaluate and analyse a work of street art and relate it to the news and current affairs and to British Values?
- Can children suggest how an image could be altered to change its message?

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## Lesson 2, To create a symmetrical, abstract art form

#### Key assessment questions:

- Can children work in the style of Rorschach to create a symmetrical abstract image?
- Can children use my imagination to interpret and add detail to my image?

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#### Lesson 3, To use visual symbols to create a meaningful message

#### Key assessment questions:

- Can children create a meaningful message using visual symbols?
- Can children describe how people throughout history have used visual symbols?

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# Lesson 4, To evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design and To use drama as a tool to explore the meaning behind a piece of artwork

#### Key assessment questions:

- Can children express how a piece of artwork makes them feel?
- Can children compare events in a piece of artwork to current news and the 'Fundamental British Values'?
- Can children use drama to demonstrate my understanding of the meaning of a piece of artwork?

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# Lesson 5, To develop ideas for 3D work through drawing and visualisation in 2D.

#### Key assessment questions:

- Can children use their whole arm to draw big shapes?
- Can children use curved lines to suggest three dimensional shapes?
- Can children name key features of Magdalene Odundo's artwork?

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
